To help a child learn the differences between right and wrong parents and teachers should provide <u>an environment</u> in which children become more familiar with the consequence of their manner and learn self-control. One of the crucial goals of school discipline is to teach students to behave in an acceptable way by contributinged to the educational success.

In conclusion, imposing <u>a</u> punishment which fit<u>s</u> the crime could be considered <u>as</u> the best practice in a good family upbringing. Influence of making them participate in <u>community service social-careactivity</u> for instance is much better than punishment.
