Some students prefer classes with open discussions between the professor and students and almost no lectures. Other students prefer classes with lectures and almost no discussions. Which do you prefer? Use specific reasons and examples to support your answer.

While there are advantages to both classes which where the professor talks all of the time and classes that where/in which students get cooperate with the professor. I completely agree that classes with open discussion are more beneficial due to the fact that students could learn a lesson much easier and it would help them to develop their social skills. I feel this way for two reasons which I will explore in the following essay.

To begin with, classes where students would get involved, could help them to improve their intellectual abilities. It has been said that "repeating what others have said requires education, to challenge it requires brain". Students who participate in classes got-get a higher score than those who do not participate in discussion. In addition, the more you teach others, the more you learn. They <u>are</u> usually shy and can't communicate well. These discussions could help them to develop their gregarious skills. Moreover, they would work in group<u>s</u>. My younger brother's experience demonstrates this point. When he started university, he was <u>quite a very</u> reticent person. After a while, he tried to join discussions along with others. The professor defined an assignment that students should do in pair. Since he was joining discussions, everyone had known him and he had found a classmate very easily.

In conclusion, I strongly believe that classes (which <u>are )have</u> more concentrate<u>d on in</u> discussion are more useful than those <u>classes</u> in which professors <u>take give</u> lectures all of the time. This is because students take advantage of <u>(engagement)</u> being involved and ready for their future <u>especially in their</u> <u>career</u>.
