## Many people move to other countries for work. Children of their families are benefited by this. However, some believe that it affects the children badly. Discuss both views and give your opinion.

These days going to other countries for working as a skill<u>ed</u> worker has become easier than the past and even relocating workforces in the most of <u>the</u> time does not need any visa. However, there are a few investigations into effects of this change on people who choose to go and their dependents especially children who are the weakest.
