Some people believe that a great difference in age between parents and children is more beneficial. Do you think the advantages of a greater difference in age between them outweigh the disadvantages?

On the other side, opponents <u>are</u> concerned <u>about</u> for the biological clock of each person deciding to be a parent. That young individuals are less likely to have problems related to the health, is a given fact needless to point out. therefore, biologically speaking, it is far safer to become a mother or father in younger ages.

At any rate, I firmly believe in balanced points of views but if I should choose just one <u>utmost-single</u> option, my opinion would be more inclined to the <u>elder-older age</u> parenthood in <u>nowadays-today's</u> life.
