Some people believe that entertainers (e.g. film stars, pop musicians or sports stars) are paid too much money. Do you agree or disagree? Which other types of jobs should be highly paid?

In almost every part of the globe celebrated artists and <u>sportsperson</u> are paid more than others. This has become the subject of a heated debate in different levels of societies. Opponents of such high pays argue these controversial payments can lead to an unbridgeable gap <u>between</u> people. This short essay elaborates my view points on this contentious topic.
