Organized tour<u>s</u> to remote community and other countries <u>is are</u>increasingly popular. Is it a positive or negative development for the local people and environment?

The past few years have witnessed the burgeoning growth of organized tour<u>s</u> to secluded parts both domestic and international. My contention is that this phenomenon brings both beneficial and adverse outcomes <u>on to</u> locals and environmental quality.

Tourist packages offers definite perks to local residents, they can enjoy the amelioration in living standards, more utilities, transportation infrastructures and many other beneficial impacts on <u>indigenous'</u> lifestyle.

First and foremost is that increasing <u>the</u>longing for visit<u>ing the</u>countryside and farflung retreats has caused <u>exposing</u> serious threats if <u>it such trips</u> <u>is are</u> not organized well. <u>The</u> polluted water and littering are the result of increasing visits to remote areas. Secondly, <u>the</u> local wild life and vegetation are also vulnerable to destruction. The example substantiating this statement is, when travelers bribed the authorities to hunt wild animals. <u>the Aftermath aftermath</u> of which <u>was,has been</u> elephants and rhinoceros hunted down to extinction.

Furthermore, apart from this potential peril, intrusion in<u>to/on</u> local custom<u>s</u> and traditions is a big concern and it can <u>leads</u> to <u>culture cultural</u> extinction. The propensity to aping others can be a detrimental fact to religions of tribes and their beliefs. People can also imitate the way travelers use garments and consumer goods which will <u>make perish</u> the local customs <u>perish</u>.

To conclude, I would reiterate my decision that if tourist packages <u>was-were</u> not well organized it could be really harmful irrespective of the good points that <u>they</u> brings about with <u>itthem</u>. To mitigate the adverse outcome of tourism new legislations should be passed by governments.
