Euthanasia has been in the news more and more. many people are strongly against such a practice, but there is growing demand to have it legalized. How far do you agree with euthanasia being made legal?

Patients that are suffering from an unhealed disease have a fundamental right over their own body. For example, recently the gold medal winning athlete "Marieke Vervoot "has died after taking her own life via mercy killing.
