Some people believe that unpaid community service should be a compulsory part of high school programmes (for example working for a charity, improving the neighborhood or teaching sports to younger children).

Working without <u>payments</u> for the students is a contentious issue in societies. To my mind though Internship in high school has a positive <u>effects</u>, it <u>can not works</u> as mandatory <u>programmer</u> and it is better to advise <u>the</u> youth to do that and let them <u>to</u> decide <u>weather</u> they want to do <u>it</u> or not.

<u>Studding-Studying</u> only in the classes and <u>not have havingnot</u> any practical knowledge about <u>the</u> society, students are faced with problems after passing <u>the</u> high school. They <u>have not</u> enough knowledge about their abilities and are not <u>familiars</u> with the <u>carriers careers</u> which they want to <u>selects</u> for themselves and community service <u>help</u> them make a difference and decipher which careers they are more or less <u>well</u>. For instance, some of the youth who selected engineering majors in colleges after 2 or 3 years <u>changing</u> or <u>abolish</u> their <u>studding</u> field because of less information about their fields. If they had find enough informations, they would have selected suitable major for their flutters.

Students who work for charities <u>are</u> more likely than those who do not <u>work</u> to feeling <u>society social</u> situations such as orphans <u>children</u> or people who live in poverty and it gives them a realistic view and helps their humanity aspect.

In spite of the above mentioned, unpaid <u>works</u> do not have profound effects in a mandatory program <u>and but rather may have</u> <u>maybe it has</u> negative influences. For example in my country the governments forced high school students to attend <u>in</u> unpaid courses in <u>a-the</u> summer, but <u>where assince</u> some of them did not like practical <u>action-work</u>, <u>it-they</u> did not work and <u>were</u> <u>have abolished</u>.

To sum-up, I think it is better to encourage students to attend <u>in valuating voluntary</u> services and <u>explain</u> todescribe <u>for</u> them the advantages of <u>this those</u> activities, but mandatory internships <u>can not</u> be useful for students.
