Some universities now offer their courses on the Internet so that people can study online.

Is this a positive or negative development?

Nowadays, with technological improvements, specifically the Internet bandwidth, and growing websites and platforms, online education has become a hot trend. It seems that some universities tend to embrace this new occasion to develop their education system. Although, likewise other issues, online training includes various advantages and disadvantages, I tend to declare that this opportunity have has/offers numerous benefits for society and should not be ignored easily.
