People living in big cities face many problems today. What are the problems? Should the government encourage people to live in regional towns?

The prime measure is those preparing overall needs, which <u>are mostly missing</u> in rural areas. <u>This That</u> is, a majority of regional towns have inadequate amenities and essential facilities, and should governments persuade people to immigrate to other states in the country in order to achieve a correct balance, they must establish companies, factories, higher educational institutes. Hence, <u>it this policy</u> elevates the standard of living in rural areas.
