Some people believe that there should be fixed punishment for each type of crime. Others, however, argue that the circumstances of an individual crime, and the motivation for committing it, should always be taken into account when deciding on the punishment. Discuss both these views and give your own opinion

Creating a system for judging and disciplining villains is quite an important issue. In conclusion, a system which <u>takes into account spot</u> every aspect of a crime and <u>treats</u> every criminal differently would be more preferable for our communities. <u>Unlessalthough</u> achieving this goal <u>completely</u> is not feasible, <u>but</u> we should <u>spare no effort/</u>try to create a system which is close to it.
