## Disruptive school students have a negative influence on others. Students who are noisy and disobedient should be grouped together and taught separately. Do you agree or disagree? Give reasons for

Presence of noisy and disobedient pupils in school classes seems to be inevitable. This fact may make both teachers and other students irritated. We must also consider that this naughtiness is emerged from the context of the adolescence-ages, and if we attempt to shut this down, unrecoverable influences may invade this budding flourished generation.

Thus, teachers and schools have magnificent-major responsibilities for these this category of students. They must be involved in class
activities, assessments and tests as much as the other students. If this happens, it will be in all the students' interest; and both will be satisfied.
