It is important for children to learn the difference between right and wrong at an early age. Punishment is necessary to help them learn this distinction.

On the other hand, many people have strong views toward <u>do punish</u> children from infancy and even let <u>to tutor to wit</u> children in schools to prevent that fault for the second <u>times</u> and they believe that this is a only way to prevent from being spoil and impolite.

From my point of view, <u>now days most of families</u> are child-driven and punishment is <u>phase</u> out in <u>compare</u> to the past and most of the parents try to tackle this issue <u>by policy</u> instead of <u>violence</u> attitude.
