Some people believe that children's leisure activities must be educational, otherwise they are a complete waste of time.

Nowadays, in this rapidly progressing world, lots of parents might consider the secure future of their children <u>entailed</u> with either education or educationally related activities, whereas I strongly believe that having no spare intervals in order to freely enjoy the moments can even ruin the whole upcoming dreams.

Parents' concerns as to how a child's <u>furture</u> life could become guaranteed are all reasonable which <u>adress</u> why they are having such attitudes toward the issue.
