Nowadays, traffic and pollution problems have been considered by governors, in particular, in <u>a metropolitan</u> and it is <u>suggested</u> to control it by increasing the cost of petrol. Although it could have an effect on decreasing them, I believe, only if we make it culture, can we expect such these problems to be solved. This essay has been written in order to put forward some solutions to reduce traffic and pollution problems.

First and foremost, the reason why the existence of such these problems exist is are related to lack of an equally suitable public transportation which causes to be reached the conclusion that people use their own cars. Furthermore, with rising the number of public transportations such as metros or buses, not only are people enticed to use them due to being cheaper, but for its acceleration and comfort.
