<u>Participate</u> in an educational program in a foreign country is a lifelong ambition for many students all over the world. In my opinion, being involved in such international programs has many <u>advances</u> for students if the education system provides the proper requisites for them.

Firstly, by studying abroad individuals expose themselves to a new environment and culture which can expand their knowledge about other countries and in general change their perception of the world. Secondly, exchanging students needs <u>to provide</u> a raft of requirements such as accommodation, food and transportation. Thirdly, <u>hence</u> being apart from their family, students have to overcome many problems such as health ones and this may disturb their concentration.

In conclusion, although by studying abroad individuals may experience <u>much</u> more hardships than their peers <u>in their home country</u>, they will enrich their personality and broaden their horizons.
