In some countries it is thought advisable that children begin formal education at four years old, while in others they do not have to start school until they are seven or eight. How far do you agree with either of these views?

The Education system is different in countries all around the world. Some of them advise that learning different subjects has many profits for children who are at an early age. Others believe that children do not have to attend school classes until the age of reason or over. This essay will discuss both of these views/either of these views.

To begin with, some parents encourage their child to go nursery school to acquire knowledge which can contribute to <u>achieve achieving</u> some skills in some subjects that can be beneficial for their future life at an early age. Children in these schools can learn to count or even read letters through video games and play. Children are prepared with deeper perception of those subjects which will <u>be</u> present in the next years when the formal education starts. Moreover, parents should ensure that their children are enrolled in the right school to improve their child's development.
