That is to say, the more people interfere in rearing a child, the more various virtues will be introduced to them. Consequently, children will be bewildered by various rules which could negatively affect their ability to distinguish between wrong and right. In addition, grandparents and other relatives tend to be over indulgent and refrain from punishing their grandchildren for their mistakes due to their kindness which would spoil children.

In conclusion, although grandparents and whole family members can play an active and positive role in <u>up</u>-bringing <u>up</u> a child, I opine that <u>the this</u> responsibility <u>of rearing the child</u> lies with <u>their the</u> parents and <u>have having a single unique</u> parenting method<u>/approach</u> is more beneficial for families.
